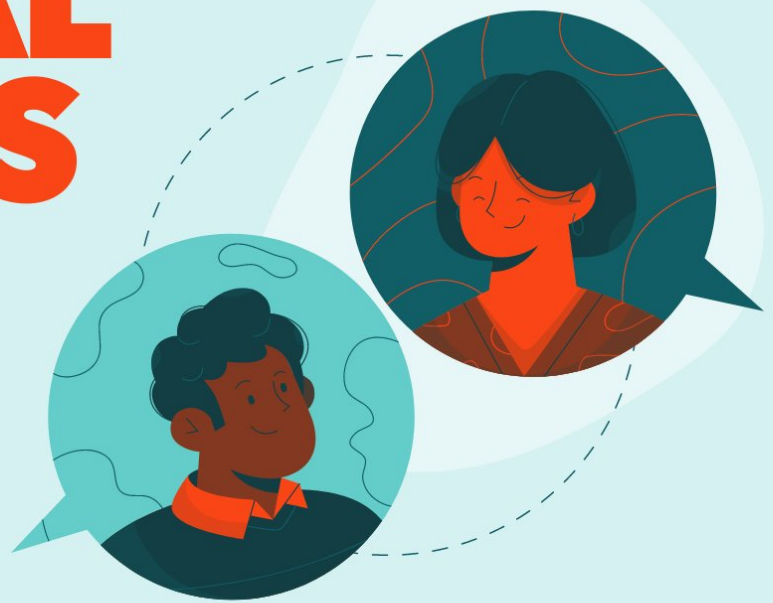

In 2021 we are still experiencing way too much violence toward women and this re-imagined version tells the story of many women's experiences of violence, assault, objectification, subjugation, and silencing. It is our hope that our voices call attention to the problem of toxic masculinity and internalized misogyny that leads to gender based violence and reminds audiences that we need to stop blaming women and start listening.

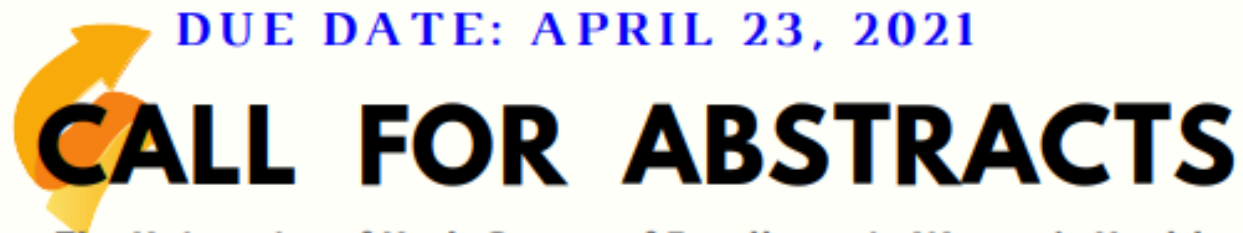
